Letter from Tina Davies, Chair of Community Within "How do we have a Community Within, when it seems like there is no "Within?"

Did you happen to catch Rayla's field trip, as she and Miriam Byroade toured the ambulatory to view an exhibit of Miriam's quilts?

This exhibit was mounted late last winter... February perhaps? ... and has understandably been inaccessible for "regular" viewing since you-know-what descended upon us. Rayla opened the doors and, with Miriam, walked us around this display of quilts extraordinary in both conception and execution. There's a strong ecological theme resonating in Miriam's pieces, calling attention both to our "place" in the universe and to those lasting effects of human intrusion upon the finite space we cohabit with other species.

As a fellow quilter, though, I was touched by the notion that these assemblies of fabric, thread, and imagination have been silently standing guard all these long and lonely months — sentinels acting witness to silence and isolation in this pandemic. Miriam's quilts, while making their statements to an unseen audience, have also been trading some physical characteristics with their surroundings. A faint woody scent has insinuated itself into the fiber, and the ambulatory walls undoubtedly retain some essence of the quilts' presence. They are, after all, doing what quilts do — giving comfort, sharing beauty, provoking imagination.

This year, I've been the representative to USH's board for the Council on Community Within. When doors began slamming shut, last March, I asked myself, "How does one have a Community Within when, basically, there is no 'Within' "? Obviously, many adaptations, adjustments, dedicated people, and work-arounds have stepped in to create virtual communities — we have Zoom coffee hours, Zoom meetings, Google-meet gatherings, Facebook-Live tours — yet the strong desire to return to one another's physical presence, in our physical building, remains. It's really difficult to have a virtual pancake breakfast. It's pretty impossible to have the tactile satisfaction of a virtual hug.

Rayla and Miriam reminded me that, yes, there is indeed a 'Within' within. The quilts are guarding it, keeping it warm for our inevitable return. And when we return, things will feel different — and we will be different. I've been asking myself, and now I'd like to ask you — what might we want? What will you want? What are your ideas on how we can re-engage with each other, in the lightly-structured manner that USH programs and social activities have typically offered? We've had discussion groups, movie nights, lunches, affinity groups... the list is long. What do we want to see, and how shall we bring such inspiration into being? I would love to hear your ideas — please send your thoughts to me at daviesush@gmail.com (the email I use for USH-related stuff).




