

USH Officially Acquires Solar Equipment Behind the Meeting House

On June 30th USH became the owner of the solar equipment located at the rear of the Meeting House. This ended a process first begun in 2015 when a group of USH members began a process to acquire the solar equipment and benefit by the then state and federal incentives for purchasing and installing such solar equipment. After studying tax law and assembling other relevant information, the group found it could only benefit from the incentives if a tax paying owner was involved. Consequently, David Newton became a Sole Proprietor and through a complex series of agreements with USH (Endowment) leased the land under the equipment from USH and provided solar electricity to USH at a cost slightly less than Eversource would charge for the same amount of electricity. In addition, ZREC (state incentive payments) for solar electricity generated onsite were paid to USH further reducing the cost of Kilowatts used in the building. Member donations to the Endowment were loaned to the Sole Proprietor to finance the purchase and installation of the solar equipment while the Sole Proprietor paid interest on the funds benefitting the Endowment as would any other similar invested funds.

After a five-year interval, USH has now purchased the equipment and the Sole Proprietor paid off the remaining balance on the outstanding loan as well as outstanding lease costs. In the end, this process resulted in a reduction in cost of electricity used by USH over the five-year interval and now, an annual reduction of the cost of electricity used in the Meeting House to close to zero for at least the next 15 years. On an annual basis, the Meeting House consumes about the same amount of electricity the solar equipment produces.
