A Message from the Minister

Dear members and friends of USH,

I would like to share some things with you that may be of interest, and also to ask for your help and suggestions concerning a couple of things. This is in many ways an exciting time for the congregation. There is much going on, and we need your help for some specific projects that will require a commitment for a few weeks only.

The first project that needs volunteers is our annual church auction, which your Board would like to take place on the second weekend of November. As a long-standing tradition of the congregation, our annual auction has an abundance of materials that will eliminate the need to reinvent the wheel in order to put together the event. Jon Covault has a wealth of information and will be pleased to provide guidance to the auction volunteer(s).

The second project is a congregation-wide "Secret Santa" partnership with a school in one of the poorer neighborhoods of Hartford County. The names of a group of pupils of the school will be put into a hat, and a random drawing by our congregation will assign each pupil to a member-volunteer of the congregation, who will be given a copy of the child's Christmas wish list. The idea is that closer to the Christmas holiday a "USH Santa" will deliver the gifts we have collected to the children. I can fill interested volunteers in on the specific details of the project. We have already identified a potential school that would welcome your gifts during the holiday season. This project will call for a substantial number of our members and friends to donate gifts, and several of our members to handle the logistics. And, of course, we will need to have someone to be Santa. Please contact Rayla or me if you would like to help organize this very rewarding project.

More immediately, with Halloween fast approaching, please also consider helping USH to organize a "Trunk or Treat" event in the USH parking lot to take place on the last weekend of October. We would welcome your ideas and suggestions regarding a theme, the best day of the weekend to hold the event, and any other assistance or advice you would like to offer. I am also asking for a couple of volunteers to help organize the event. I think it will be a much-needed opportunity for our

community to have some enjoyable time together as we hopefully emerge more fully from the pandemic.

Updates from the Board

Here's what you should know about coming to USH:

We continue to follow CDC guidance; right now, that guidance is for everyone to wear a mask indoors, regardless of vaccination status. Bring and wear your mask; if you forget, we have a supply and will give you one. The sanctuary is large enough to accommodate comfortably all who are likely to come. We can spread out, maintaining reasonable distance from each other. It's likely that alternate pews will be cordoned off to facilitate separation.

We will continue to livestream the service on multiple platforms... you will be able to participate, even if you cannot be here in person! The capacity to feature virtual participation has been one of the (few) ongoing benefits of the pandemic.

The building has been maintained at high standards, and is in great shape. Recommended cleaning protocols have been followed scrupulously. The space is well-ventilated.

We expect many will be hesitant to return, possibly for a very long time — and that's perfectly fine! Stay home, and join us on Vimeo, Facebook, or Zoom (including coffee hour). However, you choose to be here, you are welcome.

Our Ingathering coffee hour in the Memorial Garden was so enthusiastically received, we're planning to continue outside fellowship if the weather's decent. We can mingle at discreet distances and spread out a little more. *Please take note: services start at 10:30!* If you happen to arrive at 10, that simply offers more time to visit, or meditate, or perhaps help out. Whenever, and however, you come, we'll be so happy to see you!

Social Justice

Now that we are again gathering in person, the social justice team would like to get back to having regular Good Neighbor Offerings, GNOs. We held a few during Covid but rather hit or miss. During August we raised money for uniforms for our neighbor, the Village for Families and Children. This month we would like to donate the GNO to GHIAA, The Greater Hartford Interfaith Action Alliance.

GHIAA held their formal beginning to years ago in October. At the time we had 44 members of USH present for the opening assembly. Of those, we now have 14 members who have taken the Core Team training. During the last two years GHIAA introduced and pushed to get 5 new laws passed by the legislature and signed by the governor. These impressive accomplishments include:

- 1. New Housing Laws for Hartford: to better hold large landlords accountable for the upkeep of their property and the well being of their tenants.
- 2. A law eliminating state welfare liens: The state can no longer try to collect back money from individuals who have used any form of state aid. Connecticut was one of the last two states that still had welfare liens.
- 3. Clean Slate Law: This law allows most non-violent offenders the chance to have their criminal record wiped clean after five or seven years if they do not have any violations during that time. This will increase their ability to obtain housing, secure loans, further their education, etc.
- 4. A law Declaring Racism as a Public Health Crisis: This gives the state and cities more leverage when dealing with landlords and properties where often the majority of tenants are of minorities.
- 5. Right to Legal Council When Faced with Eviction. This provides low income tenants access to public defenders when facing eviction.



This year's Organizing

School for Teams was developed in response to volunteers, State Action Networks, and congregations' desire to deepen organizing skills, develop broader networks of folx doing faith-based organizing, and join in the work of our Side With Love campaign. Complete application by July 30th HERE. We are excited to support 20-30 cohorts for this years organizing school. This program is designed for teams that are currently engaged in social justice work. We are encouraging congregational social justice teams to apply as a cohort. Priority will be given to teams who are based in AZ, FL, GA, KY, MN, NC, PA, TX, and WI. You may apply as an individual. If admitted you will be placed in cohorts based on geographic location. All sessions are recorded and applicants regardless of acceptance into as a cohort, will have access to recorded sessions.

Cohorts will receive up to 10 hours of 1-1 organizing support following the completion of 80% of all sessions.

Sessions will take place on Wednesdays, 6:30-8:30pm ET/3:30-5:30pm PT between Aug. 25 and Nov 3.
