A number of people have already volunteered to organize our Trunk or Treat event on Halloween weekend. If you would like to participate, or need more information, please get in touch with Rayla, Dana Donovan or Marye Gail Harrison.

I am also very grateful to Rayla for organizing our congregation-wide "Secret Santa" partnership with a local Hartford school. Some folks have already expressed interest and we are optimistic that we can have an impact on the lives of some deserving children over the holidays.

To recap what we are planning to do, the names of a group of pupils of the school will be put into a hat, and a random drawing by our congregation will assign each pupil to a member-volunteer of the congregation, who will be given a copy of that child's Christmas wish list. Closer to the Christmas holiday a "USH Santa" will deliver the gifts we have collected to the children.

We have already identified a school that would welcome your gifts during the holiday season. This project will call for a substantial number of our members and friends to donate gifts, and several of our members to handle the logistics. And, of course, we will need to have someone to be Santa. Please contact Rayla if you would like to help with this exciting and generous project.

I am also very excited to remind everyone that we are planning to have a multigenerational holiday pageant during our service on December 19th. The pageant will be an enactment of the Twelve Days of Christmas as told in the wonderful story about a farm girl and a prince in Emma's Christmas, by Irene Trivas. (We will have a few copies of the book available for people to read and pass along to others. It is not available on Amazon, but there are some inexpensive used copies available from other vendors for those who would like to purchase a copy.)

Because of COVID considerations and the mixed in-person and Zoom attendance, we will need to be creative in the way in which we prepare the service, including possibly asking some participants to prerecord their parts at home on their cell phones. We will need members of our congregation to participate with our children and youth to participate as Lords-a-Leaping, Maids-a-Milking, Swans-a-Swimming, and ... you get the picture. Rayla and Marye Gail Harrison are the contact persons for the pageant, and I will also be supporting them in helping to organize the event. I hope that we can get as many volunteers as possible to make this year's pageant an event to remember notwithstanding the COVID and technical challenges.

Thanks to all our children and youth who participated and sent in videos for our animal blessing last week! It was such a joy to see all your faces.

Since we had a multigen service, we will be doing our 4th week of the 1st principle this week. If you have not done so, please visit our FB page for an update on this year's program and to hear the first story.

1st Principle: The Inherent Worth and Dignity of Every Person.

On the surface it seems so simple to respect

ourselves and others. However, the last few years have shown me that it's not always easy to show respect and hold everyone's dignity with respect and worth. Especially during those times when we truly disagree with someone or when they have caused us or a loved one harm. During those times we asked ourselves how can we still value and uplift this person when they are causing so much harm?

This 4th week of exploring our 1st principle. I hope you have really spent some time with this principle over the last few weeks: reflecting on how you may or may not have been aware of its existence or lack thereof in your daily life. It is something I work on and think about a lot. I also find it's one of the main ones I often ponder with my kids and we incorporate it into many of our discussions. So, this week, I would like you to engage with someone on the topic of the worth and dignity of us all. I would encourage you to put some meaning and thought into who you choose to engage with. Maybe you pick someone from our directory and write them your thoughts; maybe it's a phone call to someone you've been meaning to talk to; maybe it comes in the form of our group discussion. In addition to our RE discussions on Sunday, I will be hosting a conversation that is open to anyone. It will be on Friday the 15th at 6:30pm - HERE
We will take time to reflect on this month and the work we have done. I hope to see many of you there.

Shared Facility - Shared Responsibility

Our shared Meeting House is full of exits and windows arranged in our uniquely circular building. Part of the original design was to feature an aspect of Unitarianism, respect for the environment of which we are a part. The design placed our religion at the center of the building, our Sanctuary, with peripheral rooms broadly connected to the external environment by large windows and doors facing the bays allowing us to always be aware of what is going on outside, ...our planetary observation point, so to speak.

As you know, we have various items of value in our Meeting House, and therefore, it is prudent to secure the building when it is not inhabited. Doing this is always a challenge as different groups come and go from the meeting rooms. When your group meets, please be aware as you leave the premises of any others who remain, and if there are none, then it is your responsibility to secure the building. Designate somebody in your group to perform this function after meetings presuming your group customarily is leaving an otherwise empty building.

What is involved? you may ask. Essentially, you need to check all doors to see that they are locked. The west door may require a key to lock it from the outside. The north, south, and east doors usually can be secured by reversing the doors, so they are locked from the outside. In addition, check the bathrooms and the elevator to make sure they are empty. Obviously, you need to turn off the lights and lock the inner office door to the Ambulatory as well as the outside door. This is particularly important as the office has a concentration of valuable machinery within.

There is a detailed document about this business, but you probably know as much as you need without it. It can be produced on request.

Please be reminded for obvious reasons that we discourage eating and drinking in the Sanctuary and elsewhere where rugs will be soiled. Thank you.

Here's what you should know about coming to USH:

We continue to follow CDC guidance; right now, that guidance is for everyone to wear a mask indoors, regardless of vaccination status. Bring and wear your mask; if you forget, we have a supply and will give you one. The sanctuary is large enough to accommodate comfortably all who are likely to come. We can spread out, maintaining reasonable distance from each other. It's likely that alternate pews will be cordoned off to facilitate separation.

We will continue to livestream the service on multiple platforms... you will be able to participate, even if you cannot be here in person! The capacity to

feature virtual participation has been one of the (few) ongoing benefits of the pandemic.

The building has been maintained at high standards, and is in great shape. Recommended cleaning protocols have been followed scrupulously. The space is well-ventilated.

We expect many will be hesitant to return, possibly for a very long time — and that's perfectly fine! Stay home, and join us on Vimeo, Facebook, or Zoom (including coffee hour). However, you choose to be here, you are welcome.

Our Ingathering coffee hour in the Memorial Garden was so enthusiastically received, we're planning to continue outside fellowship if the weather's decent. We can mingle at discreet distances and spread out a little more. *Please take note: services start at 10:30!* If you happen to arrive at 10, that simply offers more time to visit, or meditate, or perhaps help out. Whenever, and however, you come, we'll be so happy to see you!



His latest collection Tangle of Souls comes
