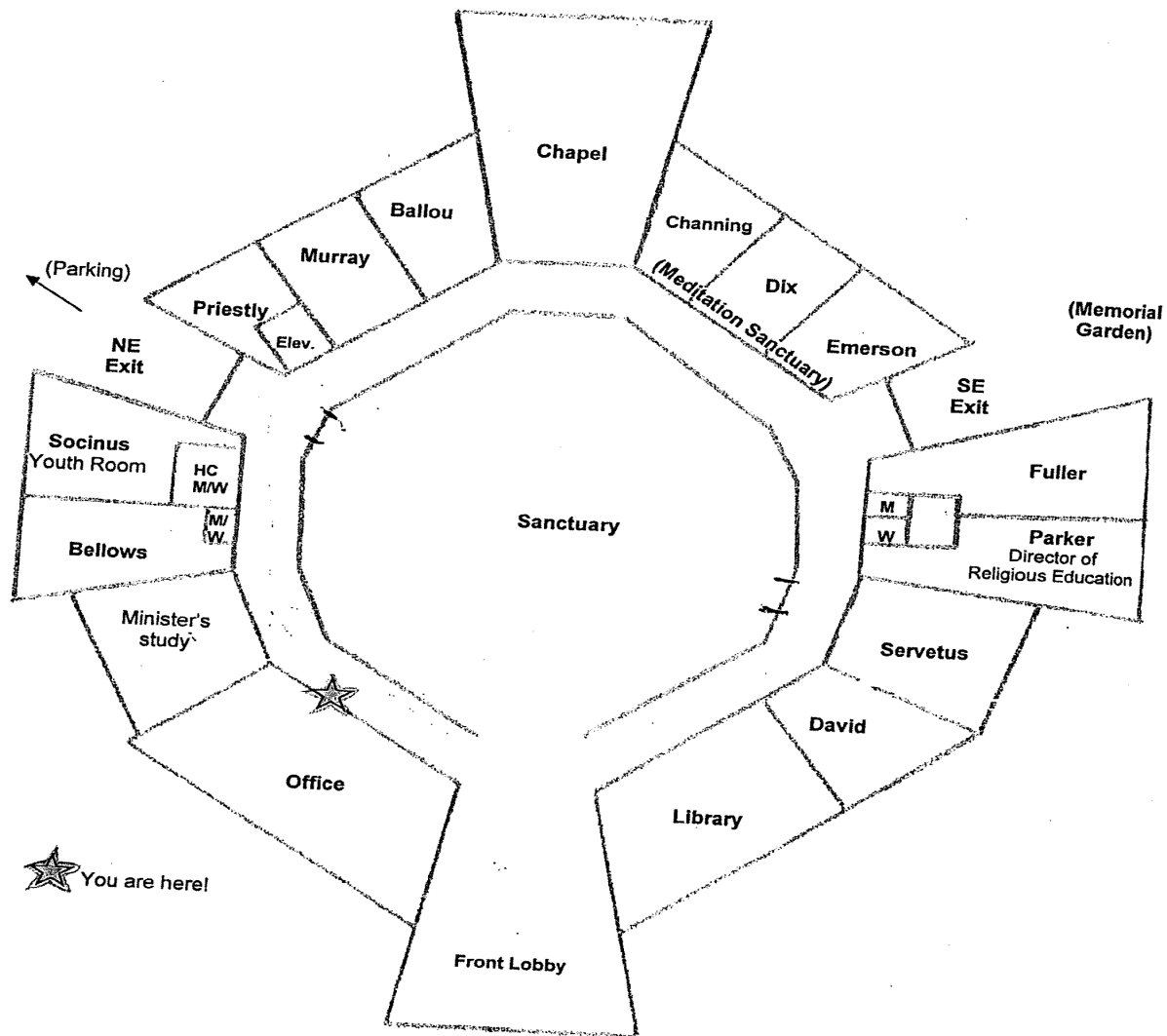

ABOUT THE AMBULATORY

Although the Meeting House was dedicated in December of 1964, the 16 rooms that open off of the ambulatory were not given the names they bear today, with the exception of the Payson Miller Chapel, until 1975. Instead they were referred to as “the High School Classroom,” “the room to the right of the chapel,” “the Library Lounge,” “the Fifth Grade Room,” “the Choir Room,” “the room to the left of the chapel,” etc. At its November, 1974 meeting, the Society Council, in a “major action,” gave guidelines to the Historical Committee by which to choose the names to be given to the classrooms on the main floor.” By May of 1975 the monthly newsletter began referring to the locations of various meetings as “the Servetus room,” “the Parker room,” and so forth.
