Easter at the Meeting House: Renewal, Revival, Rites of Spring

As Rick Tsukada commented in his pulpit message, our Easter/Spring/ Renewal morning worship was a 'mash-up' of tradition, religious lore, and festive delight at the proliferation of greenery, flowers budding, and exuberant birdsong that awakens our winter-dormant senses. This is the season where just about every culture, tradition, or religion incorporates some celebration or observance to honor the new life, and new hope, abounding with spring's arrival. Christian Easter, Jewish Passover, earth-based ceremonies for our mother Earth, Hindu Holi celebration, and this year Muslim Ramadan also coincides — all calling us to new life and new hope.

The worship team of Rick, Sue Smolski, Dana Donovan, and Diana Heymann along with Sam Moffett, presented a smorgasbord of reminiscence. They called forth memories of Easter parades, chocolate bunnies, Passover in Israel, sacred circles celebrating the earth's rebirth. Sam demonstrated their musical dexterity by performing *Phoenix Song* — the phoenix being the personification of resurrection — on saxophone and piano simultaneously! Martha Bradley's beautiful chancel art composition of flowers, keepsakes, andy symbols of light and life (see photo above) enhanced the worship theme.

Following the service, Annie Witzler invited our younger constituents to stalk and capture Easter eggs on our grounds while the grown-ups enjoyed companionship, coffee, and munchies in Fellowship Hall. It was warming to see people chatting and lingering over food and conversation, and brought to mind how *hungry* so many of us have been for the simple pleasure of each other's company and friendship.


