



Our traditional Ingathering

Service signals the start of the church year in the sanctuary. This year it will be in three parts: 1) a dedication of the new sanctuary lights; 2) our traditional Water Ceremony; and 3) a hybrid simple potluck/picnic-style lunch at coffee hour time. In the Water Ceremony, (sterilized!) water from years past is mixed with new water from your summer travels or, perhaps your back yard or kitchen tap. Bring a small quantity of water to add to the communal "water chalice." The traditional coffee hour will include hot dogs, hamburgers, and veggie burgers for all who care to partake. If you are moved to bring a contribution of a "finger food" or dessert, please do, but it is optional. (Finger food can be eaten out-of-hand or easily with a plastic fork. Congregational Matters

Governance Task Force Proposes Constitutional, Board Structure Changes

Background: Through the years, our society's constitution and its organizational structure have changed, adapting to needs and circumstances as these presented themselves. Some changes have been gradual and incremental: often prompted by advances in technology. Other changes were more substantial, such as the vote a dozen or so years back to reduce the size of the USH Board from 12 to 8 members. In addition, a number of groups have been convened to look at USH from a strategic planning perspective.

When Rev. Terry Cummings began her service last year, she suggested a strategic planning group be reconvened, to review our existing structure and how well it could serve us in this post-pandemic landscape. An open invitation was extended to the congregation, seeking members with time and interest to dedicate.

Seven volunteers responded: Rob Spector, Eve Pech, Gloria Francesca Mengual, Sue Tenorio, Brian Harvey, Beverly Spence, and Laura Stewart Cipriano. This group met between December '21 and June '22 and is now ready to present its findings and recommendations for congregational contemplation and action.

Summary of Findings: Laura Cipriano has condensed the group's work below; an extended article with additional detail appears here on the website. "This year's Strategic Planning Task Force took a different approach from recent years at USH, deciding to focus on the governance structure.

Key areas of concern for continued vigor at USH are stewardship and membership.

The Governance Task Force made these recommendations after meeting December through June 2021 – 22:

- 1. Modify the role of the past president. The expertise of the outgoing president would be very helpful on the new board. Chairing the nominating committee is not the best use of this expertise.
- 2. Add two new councils to the governance structure: a Stewardship & Finance Council and a Membership Council.
- 3. Create two additional Council Chairs, modifying the current Board structure to add two Council Chairs, one for Membership and one for Stewardship, so that there will be a total of 6 Council Chairs, a President, President-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer.

One new council would be formed by dividing the Administration Council into Administration Council and new Stewardship & Finance Council. Both are important areas and stewardship is a year-round responsibility worthy of a seat on the board.

The second new council would be formed by dividing the Council on Community Within in two: Council on Community Within and a new Membership Council.

The Board voted to support this new structure at the July meeting. The next steps are to meet with the congregation for Q&A and then to use the suggestions to amend the USH constitution, adding the two new councils and changing the past-president's duties.

The USH Governance Task Force will hold a Question & Answer congregational meeting on September 18, 2022, after the Sunday service to discuss the proposal. We will use your ideas as we continue to develop and refine this proposal.

CIRI is September's GNO

Our Good Neighbor Offering (GNO) for September will go to CIRI — Connecticut Institute for Refugees and Immigrants. CIRI provides a compassionate array of high-quality legal, social, and educational programming for refugees, immigrants, and survivors of human trafficking and torture. Operating since 1918, CIRI has assisted refugees and immigrants in becoming self-sufficient, integrated, and contributing members of their communities.

CIRI is a statewide leader and collaborator in delivering services and training, with offices in Hartford, Bridgeport, Stamford, and Waterbury. Included among CIRI's many current programs are:

- ° Resettlement for Ukrainian refugees (one of three primary resettlement agencies in CT)
- °A Rental Assistance Program for undocumented immigrants and others not eligible for federal assistance during the Covid-19 pandemic (operated with the CT Department of Housing)
- ° A comprehensive workforce readiness and employment support program.
