#### Scam Alert: Be Aware!

At this time of year we always have some members of our congregation scammed by various hackers and other malefactors. We have already learned of one. Please see example that follows the article.

So, you just heard from Friendofthefamily that there is a sudden need for a little financial help. You think about it for a minute, then determine perhaps she is reaching out for some minor help with shopping, or a bill of some kind given her age and social security income. You glance at the email address to make sure it is hers, it is. You write back and she explains the situation in a return email. So, you send some money or perhaps a gift card.

#### You have been scammed!

You see, Friendofthefamily had her email account hacked. Perhaps she heard from her "email provider" that she needed to make adjustments to her account. And she did. What happened was the hacker, Nastyperson, now uses her account to write to her contacts and may even read their responses coming back, or simply forward her incoming mail to his own address, thereafter, he is able to answer your kind email response and soon relieve you of excess funds, gift cards, etc.

Regrettably, at this time of year scams of all sorts are prevalent and successful. Friendofthefamily is stuck at the airport and lost wallet and is desperate to pay for a ticket home. The electric bill has not been paid and the power will be turned off if... The Minister, or worship associated, or caring network, needs a little help with a situation in the congregation.

You get the point. If it has to do with your email account, never respond giving out your password. Suspicious, call the Friendofthefamily by phone. Look up the number of your email provider and confirm the communication. Verify and never send cash. Use a credit card.

Hi, how are you doing?

I need a favor from you, please email me as soon as you get this message.

There is something I need you to do for me, I am going into a meeting now with limited phone calls, so please just reply my email.
