## A New Year's Message From the Board

The USH Board of Directors wishes everyone a very Happy New Year. We are glad to say that the state of the Unitarian Society is sound. We know that the first thing on everyone's minds is our

search for minister. We have submitted our application to the UUA through its Ministry Search portal, and its receipt has been acknowledged:

#### "Record is Awaiting Approval

Regional Staff have been notified your ministerial opportunity is awaiting approval. They will review it soon, and may be in contact with your search committee about any questions or clarifications they have. You will be notified via email when it has been approved, and it will then appear automatically on the jobs board page."

We are searching for a one year contract minister beginning as soon as Spring 2023. The contract can be renewed after a year. Our submission runs a full 26 pages and makes for very interesting and informative reading. (We anticipate being able to share a link to the online post once it has been made accessible.) The first part of the document describes several aspects of USH: our members come from a cross section of Connecticut's counties; our church is beautifully distinctive; our Hartford location affords access to cultural and religious affiliations; our history has been long standing and influential and we are financially sound supported by a healthy endowment. It is important that our membership understand, however, that the pool of potential ministers in very small and that we may have to be patient till we find the right candidate.

There is no denying that 2022 has been a year that posed big challenges to USH but thanks to the support of so many in our church community, our worship associates have continued to provide inspiration and solace from the pulpit and thanks to the efforts of our Caring Network, USH has been able to secure pastoral support. An expanded office administrator position has been filled. We have secured a grant to gain historic building status, and have begun to improve security measures at the Meeting House.

In our efforts to respond to members' requests for greater Board transparency we have revived some former practices and

initiated some new ones: board members will be available to meet with members "under the stairs" on the fourth Sunday of each month; Board minutes will be made more quickly available to our membership before the next meeting; and a draft agenda will be posted the week before regularly scheduled board meetings.

As we move forward into the new year, let us focus on our strengths and talk up our successes. We must face the challenges of the future with a collective allegiance to our great covenant – to dwell together in peace, to seek the truth in love, and to help one another.


