

# **USH News**

### **Annual Meeting Action Summary**

The Annual Meeting, during which USH typically brings before the congregation a review of the past year as well as any matters requiring a congregational vote, took place last Sunday (5/21/2023). An <u>Annual</u> **Report** had previously been compiled, summing up activities and accomplishments during the 2022/23 year.

#### Items presented for discussion, if necessary, and for voting:

- 1. Our USH Constitution has stated that only members *present* may vote; however, there is no specification that a person needs to be physically present, and in recent years it has been common to interpret virtual participation as present. The membership was asked to affirm the interpretation of virtual, or electronic, presence as "being present" for the purpose of satisfying a quorum and voting. This was unanimously approved.
- 2. At the 2022 Annual Meeting, the Social Justice Council introduced the idea of dividing undesignated Sunday offerings (cash or unspecified-purpose checks) evenly between USH and the Good Neighbor Offering recipient of the month. It was agreed, at the time, to test this arrangement for one year, and

then determine whether to make it permanent. As the program appears to have been successful, the congregation was asked to approve institutionalizing the plan, and the vote to make the 50/50 share permanent was unanimously approved.

- 3. A list of proposed changes to the USH Constitution had been presented by the Governance Task Force (see **HERE**) and the congregation was asked for approval. The vote was substantially in favor of approval; there were two votes against the changes.
- 4. Considering proposed alterations by the UUA to Article II of its bylaws, the congregation was asked whether they were in favor of advancing the proposed revisions for consideration and final acceptance at the 2024 General Assembly, or whether a preference existed for the proposed revision not to be advanced (in other words, that the current Article II with its exposition of Principles and Sources would continue essentially in its existing form). This vote, while not binding, has been requested so the delegates to GA may be informed of the general attitude of the congregation toward the proposed changes. The reported vote tally indicated that, among those present and voting in Fellowship Hall, 40 members were **not** in favor of advancing the proposed revision, while 13 voted in favor of the revision. The vote on Zoom indicated 3 members were **not** in favor, and 1 voted in favor of the changes.

The final vote elected members of the 2023/24 Board of Directors. Effective July 1, the Board will be constituted s follows:





## USH Paving Project

The driveway/front parking area reconstruction project is under way; top surfaces are removed, and we are in a compacting phase prior to final grading and resurfacing.



One important point to

notice, though, is that <u>the parking area is not level with the walkway</u> leading to the front entrance. Use caution — watch your step!

This week, attention has focused on the sidewalk: several slabs of pavement, cracked and uneven, have been removed and repoured, creating a smooth, level

surface. When you come this Sunday, you should be able to walk upon these new squares without fear of tripping.

During the paving process, plans are to generally have one of the two driveways available for use, allowing access to the large north parking lot. The results should provide new pavement and improved drainage to catch basins.

## May Good Neighbor Offering



The May good neighbor offering recipient is the **Veterans for Peace Golden Rule Project.** In 1958 four Quaker peace activists attempted to sail a 34 ft. ketch named Golden Rule to the Marshall Islands to try and halt nuclear weapons testing. They were boarded and arrested in Honolulu. The Golden Rule sank in 2010 but has been restored and has been sailing around the United States since 2015 with the goal of

eliminating nuclear weapons.

The ship will be in Connecticut starting on Memorial Day, and will arrive in the Hartford area on June 5. The Central Connecticut chapter of Veterans for Peace, the Quaker Meeting House, Hope Out Loud, and others are organizing welcoming/educational events and arranging support for the Golden Rule and its crew.

Donations will go to Chapter 42 of Veterans for Peace to cover local expenses. Any leftover funds will go to the Golden Rule Project.

#### Champions for Children: The Village for Families and Children

Where real change happens

On May 17, I represented the Unitarian Society of Hartford at

Champions for Children — The Village for Families and Children Annual Meeting, along with over 200 other friends of The Village. We heard from Galo Rodriguez, CEO of The Village, who reported that thousands had received services from The Village in the last year. The Village has a new short term Trauma Facility, which is designated for children and youth suffering from severe trauma . After they are stabilized these children are either returned home or sent to a psychiatric hospital when a bed becomes available.

We heard from a man and woman who were fostering-to-adopt two young siblings about the joys and difficulties of being foster parents. They could not have been foster parents without the continuing support offered by The Village. There is an enormous need for foster parents in our state.

A self-possessed tween-ager spoke about attending a basketball clinic through the Extended Day Treatment program, an after-school program for children who need additional support. The clinic was sponsored by the Connecticut Sun WNBA basketball team. His mentor, former, WNBA player Morgan Tuck was by his side. He described the experience of being in the clinic as feeling part of a group and helping him to develop skills in teamwork, cooperation and communication. As I was leaving, he proudly showed me his basketball, autographed by the whole Sun team.

# **Events Around CT**

Sailing for a Nuclear Free World and a Peaceful, Sustainable Future

Historic Sailboat Project Supports UN Treaty to Ban Nuclear Weapons



In 1958 four Quaker peace activists sailed the Golden Rule toward the Marshall Islands in an attempt to halt nuclear weapons testing. The US Coast Guard boarded her in Honolulu and arrested her crew, causing an international outcry. The arrest of the crew and the raising awareness of the dangers of radiation led to worldwide demands to stop nuclear testing.

This spurred the U.S., the U.S.S.R., and the U.K. to sign the Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty of 1963. In 2010, the Golden Rule was rebuilt in Humboldt Bay, Northern California, and is now, "Sailing for a Nuclear Free World and a Peaceful, Sustainable Future."
