

Turns out we have a storage room off Fellowship Hall with a seven-foot sewage ejection tank below the floor. This tank receives all the drainage from various sinks, toilets, and some drains throughout the building. Inside the tank there are two electric motors attached to high pressure pumps. Each motor and pump can pump the contents of the tank periodically upward and out to the sewer main, located in the parking lot by the berm grassy

Recently we discovered a red reset button on one of the electrical circuits to a pump had popped out, and a reset was not possible. Further study indicates the problem is not with the electrical connection; rather, the associated motor/pump inside the tank has failed.

and has been given a green light to proceed with Phase One of remediation on Wednesday, July 5. This entails removing, first, the inoperative pump unit, which is approximately 60 years old (original equipment, circa 1964 or so) and very heavy. Thus, large equipment (similar to an automotive shop lift) is brought in, to support the pump during disconnection and removal, thereby preventing damage to the remainder of the system. During this process, cables, pipes, and other large, obstructive gear

will be run through Fellowship Hall, rendering it unusable for the day. Further, we expect water will be shut off for the duration. It will be most practical to close

function normally. Until the pump can be extracted, it is impossible to know what replacement equipment will be required: there are several known options for that
