#### Weekly Update from Space Station USH

This past Sunday, we were treated to an engaging, thoughtful, and very *creative* service by members of our Artist's Way program. Marye Gail Harrison talked about a concept that has meant a lot to me, as a fellow creative: the state of "flow".

Basically, to be "in the flow" is where you are pursuing some meaningful, challenging activity, so much so that you become completely engaged.

Have you ever gotten so into some project that you totally lost track of time? That's the state of flow. It often happens for me when I'm writing. But also gardening, painting hiking, mathematics, or being in a conversation. These all are opportunities to enter that state where we feel involved in something that takes us outside of ourselves – in a quite deep, neurological way (*Flow: The Psychology of Optimal Experience*, by Mihail Csikszentmihalyi gives more details, if you're curious.)

What experiences, for you, bring *you* meaning and challenge? What activities cause *you* to lose track of time? You can take a moment this week to observe how you yourself change when you're doing something that puts you "in the flow." As for me, this week I'll be meeting people and planning the service for this Sunday – two of my favorite activities.

#### Security Camera and Keycode Door Installation Progress

What you see, on the left (or above if you are using your mobile device), is what will greet us — and visitors — for the foreseeable future as people approach the front door of the Meeting House. The system is not yet "live", but there's visible progress (along with some not-so-visible).

To date, the keypad and door camera have been installed by the main door. Wires to connect the cameras have been strung, and two security cameras have been

mounted so far. If you've recently visited the building during the week, you might have encountered the installer on a ladder, in the lobby, as he weaves wire connections through ceiling slats. We do not have a projected "end date" for the installation, but are aiming for sometime in August. Training on the system will begin when the installation is complete. See below — *Do You Have a Key?* — for more on procedures to be put into place.

#### Do you have a key?

The Meeting House is installing a new keyless entry system this month. This is part of USH's ongoing effort to upgrade security around our Meeting House.

The keyless entry pad will be installed on the main entrance to the lobby. During regular business hours there will be doorbell access to the building for visitors or others without codes.

After normal office hours, entry to the Meeting House will require a code to gain access to the building. To obtain a code, see Karolina Wojtysko, in the office, during regular business hours (shown above). **Forms will be available in the Fellowship Hall. If you have a key, please fill one out and bring it upstairs to the office.** 

After this keyless entry system is installed and tested, keys will no longer be functional. We expect to have the keypad system fully in use by Ingathering in September, when Sunday services move back into the sanctuary.


